

1.1 KS1 - God - Lesson 4 - Harvest.

Context:

This lesson looks at the Christian celebration of Harvest Festival. Harvest is a time when Christians say thank you to God for their food and the wonderful world that God has made.

Essential core: Christians believe that God expects humans to care for His world because it belongs to God.

INTRODUCTION:

Ask if any children know what happens at a Harvest Festival? Share with the class.

Revisit the earlier discussion about saying thank you. The Harvest service in Church is a time when Christians say thank you to God for the harvest.

BUILD UP:

Why is Harvest Festival special for Christians? They wish to say thank you to God for providing them with food. They also wish to share this food out or sell off the produce and give the money away. Why do you think it is special for farmers?

When does it happen? At the beginning of Autumn.

What do people do to celebrate? They have a service in church (or school).

What special objects might be used to celebrate? A variety of fruit, vegetables tins, packets and boxes of food.

You may wish to sing a thank you song, such as Paintbox (cauliflowers fluffy). You might sing along to the video on you tube.

TASK:

Draw and label 4 items that can be found at a Harvest Festival.

Ext pupils to write a thank you prayer to God to be used in the Harvest Festival.
